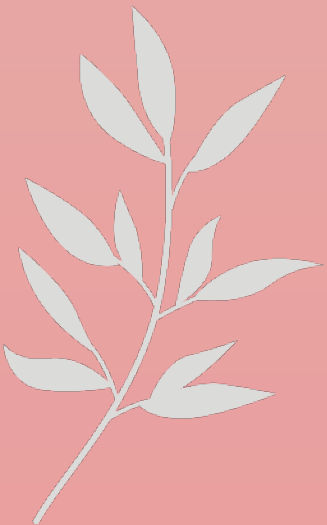

Will dwell in His eternal light.

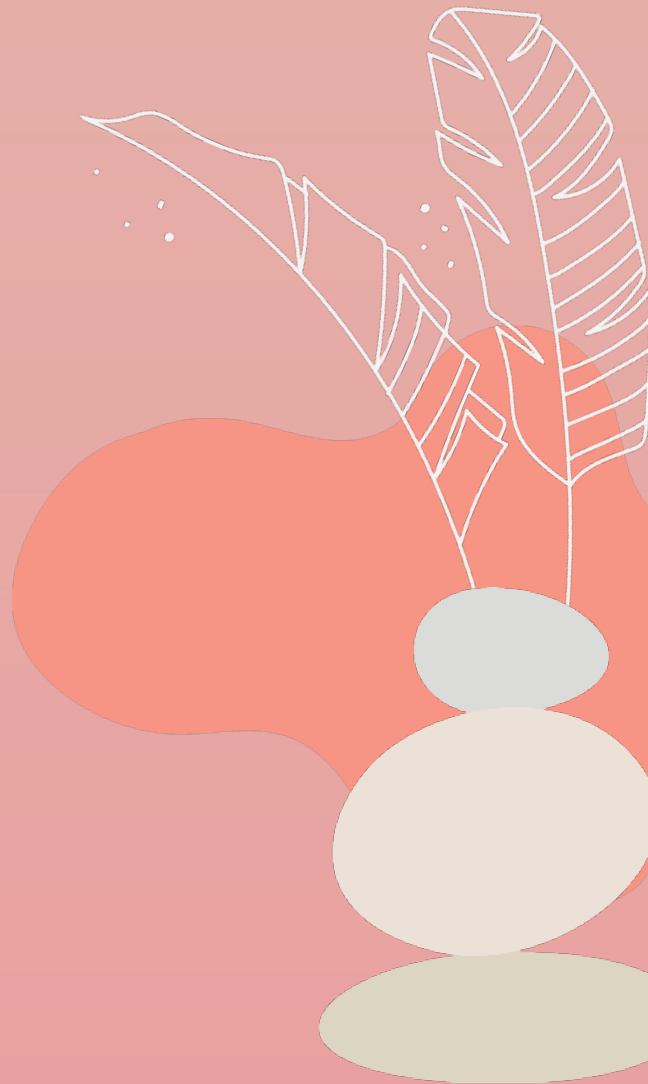
