This song gently but firmly urges the listener to stop running, to surrender, and to come home while the door of grace still stands open.



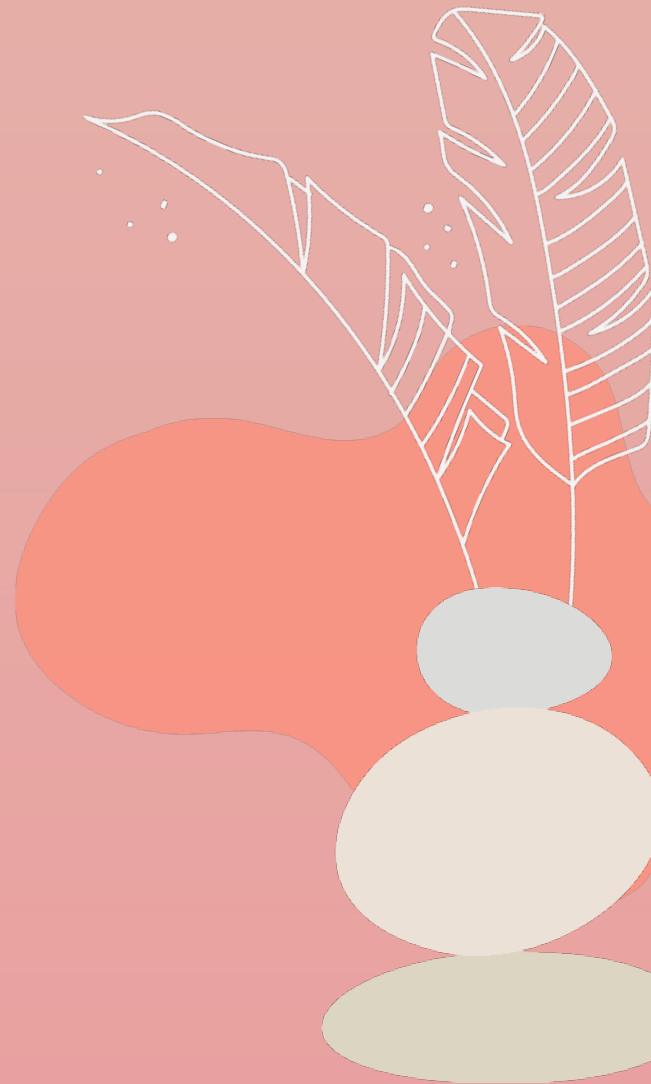
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Final Encouragement
